



## Bruce Community Facility Consultation

**Feedback** closes 23 October 2024

As promised when Council first consulted on the Bruce Community Facility, if there was a significant change to any of the key components of this project we would return for further discussions and direction from the community.

During the 2024/34 Long Term Plan (LTP) process, the updated project budget for the facility came in at around \$20 million. Given that it this considerably more than the current approved budget of \$17.6 million and, due to the level of significance, Council confirmed that the Milton Swimming Pool and Community Library project would need to go to a Special Consultative Process providing options for consideration by the community.

Now we are asking, which option is best for Milton's future?

Council is asking for feedback on whether to continue with the community library and pool facility or to stop the project.

The Bruce Community Facility has been designed as a place for everyone. Families and individuals of all ages and backgrounds from throughout the wider Bruce area will have a much-needed new multi-purpose facility that will offer a range of services. Integral to the development of this project is its communityled, partnership approach. Council and the Bruce Community Facility Trust are crucial to its success.

#### **OPTION 1 - Contribute to Community Library** and Pool facility with 6 swimming lanes (\$19.4M)

#### WHAT DOES THIS OPTION INVOLVE?

Creating a community library and pool facility that includes a six lane pool. A 505m<sup>2</sup> Community Library area, 157m<sup>2</sup> Multipurpose Space, 1,817m<sup>2</sup> Community Pool area and 198m<sup>2</sup> Community Space. Total building area of 2,677m<sup>2</sup>.

#### **ADVANTAGES/BENEFITS OF THIS OPTION**

- Both Council and the Bruce Community Facilities Trust have identified this as the preferred option.
- Caters for forecast growth for Milton.
- Creates a modern state-of-the-art community library and pool facility
- The footprint allows space for commercial/retail options that could contribute to the cost of operating the facility.

#### **DISADVANTAGES/COSTS OF THIS OPTION**

- Comes at a cost to ratepayers.
- The Three Waters Better Off Funding Support Package is at risk the Government has signalled a preference that it be used on Three Waters projects.

#### **HOW WOULD IT BE FUNDED?**

A combination of sources would be considered for funding this option as set out below:

#### OPERATING COSTS

The operating costs for the new facility is expected to be an additional \$8 on the UAGC and \$30 on the Bruce community facilities rate.

#### **OPTION 2** - Stop the current proposed project

#### WHAT DOES THIS OPTION INVOLVE?

Stop the project. Determine the current financial structural needs of both the existing facilites, along with a cost benefit analysis to decide on what future investment will be viable.

#### **ADVANTAGES/BENEFITS OF THIS OPTION**

- No impact to rates, as we would utilise current approved Long Term Plan Budgets.
- Identifies that a new pool and library is a nice to have but not essential.
- Provides an opportunity to consider alternatives to a new pool and

#### **DISADVANTAGES/COSTS OF THIS OPTION: SWIMMING POOL CURRENT SITE**

- The swimming pool grounds have been determined as unstable, therefore challenging to consider investment into a known unstable
- Known excessive investment into repairs, maintenance and infrastructure is required.
- There is a risk that following viability of site and estimation of repairs the pool could be permanently closed.

#### **DISADVANTAGES OF LIBRARY CURRENT SITE**

- There would still be the potential of future impact on rates as the library needs earthquake strengthening work.
- Building no longer fit for purpose for modern library utilisation.


